A new kind of virtual reality!

The courses will be in part carried out in a simulated resource enterprise - designed to be as realistic as possible. This innovative and new approach follows the experiential teaching method, whilst giving the students more opportunities to test out many of the business and supply chain management concepts introduced during theoretical sessions.

The virtual platform creates an alternate reality that replicates the real world and uses new technologies that facilitate the unstoppable digitalisation processes of companies in the logistics and port sector. This creates ideal conditions for students to gain invaluable skills and practical experience before entering the workforce.

The environment, sustainability and economic growth

The partners involved in the YEP MED project align their activities with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals – working together with 8 port communities around the Mediterranean to promote the most sustainable and economic transport solutions, and to arm future professionals with the necessary skills to employ them.

Our mission ultimately is to prepare the workforce to be able to improve international trade transactions, facilitate the exports of participating countries' companies, especially SMEs, and through this generate wealth through sustainable transport operations.











The YEP MED courses are divided into three parts – incorporating theory, practical visits and virtual experiences in a digital platform – and will create a group of highly skilled young people, ready to take on real-world operations following their practical experiences in the YEP MED's virtual interface.







4650 young people trained

Throughout and following the courses, project partners will seek to successfully implement a mentoring itinerary for the students – therewith further solidifying the knowledge gleamed from the courses. With companies from local port communities participating, YEP MED will thoroughly prepare the young people for the business world of tomorrow.













Thanks to the incredible support from local vocational institutes and companies, throughout the 2nd and 3rd stage of the training and thereafter, the students will be accompanied by a professional mentor who, with both academic and professional experience, will be able to help solidify the skills taught in port operations, intermodal logistics and international commerce.
